

MAKE A MOBILE

Nancy loves gazing at the twinkling stars in the sky. Do you know what else is fancy in the world up above? Planets! Create a solar system (that's fancy for outer space) mobile with the planets and Pluto revolving around the sun. Then, put your out-of-this-world mobile on display—it will add a touch of star power to any space!

SUGGESTED MATERIALS:

- 🖕 Cardboard circle (from a frozen pizza box works well!)
- Crayons, markers, colored pencils
- **Scissors**
- 👆 String
- 🕇 Tape

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Color the cardboard circle, the planets, Pluto, and the sun using the templates provided.
- Ask an adult to help you cut out each of the templates.
 - Cut ten 10-inch pieces of string.
- Tape one piece of string to the back of each template.
- Ark ten dots on the cardboard circle: one dot in the middle of the circle marking the sun and nine dots that circle the center dot along the outer edge of the cardboard.

Ask an adult to use scissors or another sharp tool to poke small holes where each of the dots is marked.

- Cone by one, take each piece of string and thread them through the holes. Use tape to secure the string to the cardboard.
- Tape another piece of string to the top center of the cardboard circle so that you can hang your cosmic creation.


Safety note: When making crafts, it is important to keep safety in mind. Children should always ask permission from an adult before using scissors.




