Follow the directions to make each -ed word.

**Focus** The inflectional ending -ed is added to verbs, which are action words. It shows past action.

#### Rule

- If a word ends in vowel -y, add -ed.
- If a word ends in consonant -y, change the y to i, and add -ed.
- If a word ends in a short vowel sound and consonant, double the final consonant and add -ed.
- If a word ends in silent e, drop the e and add -ed.

#### Example

- If a word ends in vowel -y, add -ed.  
I play. I played.
- If a word ends in consonant -y, change the y to i, and add -ed.  
I study. I studied.
- If a word ends in a short vowel sound and consonant, double the final consonant and add -ed.  
I skip. I skipped.
- If a word ends in silent e, drop the e and add -ed.  
I dance. I danced.
